STATEWIDE VOLUNTARY PRESCHOOL PROGRAM

Our first official year of the Statewide Voluntary Preschool Program wrapped up this summer. We served 13 children and are ready to take 15 new children in the fall.

lowa's Statewide Voluntary Preschool Program is an important part of the state's comprehensive early childhood effort, providing more opportunities for young children to access quality preschool and enter school ready to learn.

The preschool program is part of each child's day at Hand in Hand and is led by a licensed teacher in their classroom, reducing the need for additional transitions and transportation to and from programs!

Hand in Hand's preschool programs support the development of social/emotional skills, physical development, language development, problemsolving skills, and critical thinking skills to ready kids for a successful kindergarten experience.









PEOPLE WITH PURPOSE & AFTER SCHOOL CLUB

It's hard to believe that just a year ago we were wrapping up renovations on our brand new People with Purpose Clubhouse.

The space is now home base for our adult dayhab program and allows them a large space to cook, share meals, work on office tasks, learn life skills, and more.

Since the clubhouse has been built we've added an additional 11 participants and we've added over 30 new community partners to the long list of organizations that People with Purpose volunteer with.

In addition to a home base for PWP, the Clubhouse is also being used for our brand new After School Club (ASC).

ASC provides young adults (16-21) opportunities to spend time with peers & achieve goals while doing activities like cooking, weekly outings, games, & more. This program was formed when we found a gap in care for participants ages 18-21 who can still be in high school through their 21st year but due to licensed care laws in lowa couldn't take part in our regular school age programs.

In our first year, we served 8 participants. We then decided to carry the fun into summer by creating Adventurous Summer Club which has served 10 participants. We have a goal to serve 12 participants again when the new semester of school starts.



VOLUNTEER PROGRAM

Over the last year, our volunteer program has experienced remarkable growth and has become an integral part of our organization's success. The program has blossomed into a thriving network of dedicated individuals committed to making a positive impact on our mission.

We saw a 143% increase in volunteers for our events and a 243% increase in program volunteers!








 annual donations.



- Compensation is vitally important to the work we do at Hand in Hand. Our participants often need individualized and small group care which requires more dedicated staff members than other programs might.
- Operating costs include depreciation, accounting fees, insurance, and utility expenses.
- Program operations include food, transportation, & program supplies.
- · Special Events and Philanthropy includes fundraising costs, Chili Cook-Off expenses, and Music Fest expenses
